Refer to the Preschool Rubric to ensure PRIME TIME Preschool pillars are met in your presentation. **You are not going to be graded**. This is a **good opportunity to share, learn and improve and get a feel for storytelling together**.

There are sample questions available in the training manual, but use your imagination and come up with your own questions for your presentation. We have many other activities planned that we think will **enhance your experience** with the program.
